God bless our time together in worship today!



Today our focus is the Last Judgement. The Son of Man came once as a humble baby, but will return as a glorious king with angel armies at his side. He will sit on his throne, and all the nations will be brought before him to be judged. In this judgment, there are no shades of gray: you are either a sheep or a goat—there is no third option.

You will either be judged righteous and brought to heaven or condemned and sent into eternal fire. In our present world we see so many shades of gray, but at the judgment the contrast between believer and unbeliever will be stark. Jesus' judgment on unbelievers will be a just one, yet completely opposite of what he had wanted. Hell was never meant for humans; it had been prepared for the devil and his angels. When children of Adam are sent to hell on Judgment Day, they will enter a realm never meant for them. From the creation of the world, God had prepared an inheritance for the sons of Adam, a kingdom that becomes ours not by merit, but by grace. Both sheep and goats fail to see how their earthly lives could possibly merit their eternal fate. In fact, they speak the same words. The contrast, however, is stark: the sheep had faith in Christ that gave evidence of itself in the world; the goats had neither faith nor true fruits. Both receive an eternal judgment—life for the sheep and punishment for the goats. Lord, keep us mindful of your coming judgment that we might be found in faith, judged by your grace, and gifted with eternal life!

Matthew 25:31-46

Are you a Sheep or a Goat?

"When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit on his glorious throne. ³² All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate the people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. ³³ He will put the sheep on his right and the goats on his left. 34 "Then the King will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father; take your inheritance, the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world. ³⁵ For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, 36 I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me.' 37 "Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink? ³⁸ When did we see you a stranger and invite you in, or needing clothes and clothe you? ³⁹ When did we see you sick or in prison and go to visit you?' ⁴⁰ "The King will reply, 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.' 41 "Then he will say to those on his left, 'Depart from me, you who are cursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. 42 For I was hungry and you gave me nothing to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me nothing to drink, ⁴³I was a stranger and you did not invite me in, I needed clothes and you did not clothe me, I was sick and in prison and you did not look after me.' 44 "They also will answer, Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or needing clothes or sick or in prison, and did not help you?' 45"He will reply, 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did not do for one of the least of these, you did not do for me.' 46 "Then they will go away to eternal punishment, but the righteous to eternal life."

Voters Meeting Report

Our quarterly voters' meeting was held this past Sunday. The various reports can be viewed below. The major issue brought before the congregation was a resolution from Church Council which asked for permission to pursue an increased mortgage in order to go ahead with the building project.

The proposed resolution would allow the president and treasurer to apply for an increased mortgage amount not to exceed \$900,000. The full details of this proposal in its exact wording can be read in the file below "Proposed Resolution for Permission for Increased Mortgage". The proposal would enable the congregation to construct a building with three new preschool-ready classrooms and a set of restrooms. It would also significantly improve on our landscaping and would install a green space in the back of the property for use by the congregation and school.

The reasons for wanting to pursue this project were shared at the meeting. Here are some things that were shared:

- 1. Congregational benefits: The church stands to gain quite a bit from this project. The sanctuary will be opened up when the 5-8 class has its own room. This means more ministry opportunities during the week for the church (mid-week Bible classes, funerals, events, etc.). The plan also includes significant improvements to our landscaping/curb appeal. This will greatly help first impressions with those who come onto our campus and would likely attract new people to us. Installation of a grassy field in the back of the property would also provide an area for outdoor fellowship activities/events. Last but not least, as the school serves as a primary ministry arm of the congregation, any benefit to the school is also a benefit to the church. As the school shares God's Word with more families and engenders a culture of caring for our community, people will become interested in the church as well. As the school grows, so too will the church.
- **2. Space issues:** Enrollment is up in our grade school. To date, we have a net increase of 23 students. That increase is in spite of losing 13 students due to family moves or concerns about the coronavirus. Space continues to be an issue for the school. The 5-8 classroom is set up and taken down each week in the sanctuary. Letting each class have its own dedicated classroom space is a high priority for the school.
- **3. Growth:** Since one of the main goals for having a school ministry is reaching out to as many as possible with the gospel of Jesus, we want to enable our school to grow and serve more people. Enrollment will likely stay flat or even decrease if we don't find ways to expand what we're offering to school families. One example: we are a multigrade school, but it's hard for some families to get used to that. People are ok with having two grades together, but four in one room (grades 5-8) is tougher to sell, and we didn't succeed in enrolling a couple families this year because of this. The new building would allow us to have a 5-6 classroom and a 7-8 classroom. It would also allow us to have an additional preschool room as well.
- **4. Peoria gave us a timeline**: Peoria's approval of our site plan will expire in August 2021. After that time, we will need to reapply to get approval, which may require reworking the plan so that it is in line with current guidelines. This would include extra cost.
- **5.The financing plan is reasonable:** After crunching the numbers, our leadership has calculated a need of an additional \$900,000 in financing to achieve our goals. This additional borrowing would result in about \$50,000 a year in additional mortgage payments. Increased growth in the school and congregation will eventually be able to cover this increase. To give time for that growth, the building committee suggested seeking pledges in the amount of \$150,000 to cover the first three years of payments. *Important to note is that \$163,000 has already been raised from members of the building committee and a couple people outside that committee! Praise be to God!* In addition to this, a Go-FundMe would be launched to be a channel for school families, alumni, and people across WELS to give to the project if they would desire (some have expressed this desire).

We want all our members to know the ins and outs of this proposal. This is why we did not ask for a vote at the meeting. That vote will come on **November 8**th at 10:30am, after everyone has had some time to look through, think about, and pray about this proposal. You can also use the system by listening with provided headphones or your own headphones.

Cross of Glory was planted by the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod (WELS) in March 1998 so that with the Gospel of Jesus she can strengthen the faith of her members and reach out into the community with the free gift of salvation. First worship services began at Easter 1999; the dedication of our Ministry Center at Easter, 2005. On Easter of 2017, we began services at our second site in the Vistancia community. Our synod's name reflects that her founders began in the state of Wisconsin. As a WELS church we still hold to the teachings of the Bible restored in the Reformation era. We are...

- a Christ-preaching church. We preach that Jesus is true God, the Son of God who became man, so that through his perfect life and innocent death, He is the prophesied "Lamb of God" who has taken away the sin of the world.
- a Bible-believing church. We teach that the Bible is the verbally inspired, inerrant Word of God, the only authority for Christian faith and life. We aim to teach God's Word in all its truth and simplicity.
- an evangelical church. We trust the Bible's claim that God saves people through the power of the Gospel in the Word and Sacraments. The Gospel is the Good News (the Evangel) about Jesus' saving work. The WELS has congregations throughout the USA and around the world to share the Evangel, the Bible's primary message, with all people.
- a people-caring church. That we're all sinners equally saved by Jesus' substitutionary work strips away human judgments and egos. This truth also empowers us to live Jesus' love for all people by offering friendship, support, and Biblical counseling. Our church family cares about other people-- including you.

Our Preschool & Elementary School exists to help parents in their God-given duty of teaching the Faith to their children: an important aspect of our Church's plan to grow a comprehensive womb-to tomb ministry that serves souls for eternity.
