

Today is the first day of Holy Week. During this week, the relentless march of time slows down for Christians. We slow down this entire week to ponder all that Christ did for us, from his humble entrance into Jerusalem... to his sacrificial death on the cross... to the victory of Easter morning.

The events of Palm Sunday might not seem pivotal to our salvation. Christ sheds no blood on this day. However, Palm Sunday sets the tone for all of Holy Week. It perfectly illustrates that Jesus came to be the kind of king this world will never understand: one who conquers his enemies by surrendering to them, one who crushes his opposition by himself being crushed, one whose path to kingly exaltation begins with humiliation. This is the kind of King we have marching into battle as one of us and for all of us this week. As a result, we are drawn to him in faith rather than driven away in fear. This humble King is our only hope.



Confession of Sins





and is seated at the right hand of God the Father Almighty.


From there he will come to judge the living and the dead.



Dear members of Cross of Glory,

WELS World Missions and our church council have now worked out details regarding the conclusion of my ministry among you. Preaching and leading worship on Easter Sunday will be my last official act at Cross of Glory. That said, my family and I will still be around through the end of the school year. I will be using the time after Easter to prepare for my new ministry in Africa. I have training and conferences to attend, and it looks like a quick trip to Zambia will be happening in May so that I can obtain my work visa.

Pastor Ehlers and I are working on a transition of pastoral duties. There may be some things that I would still be able to help with in the time that I'm still around (Confirmation Sunday is an example). Worship in Vistancia will be suspended after Palm Sunday (outreach efforts to the area will continue), and the congregation will be worshiping together on the Jomax campus until further notice after that day.

The council is preparing a recommendation for the voters regarding the future pastoral needs at Cross of Glory, to be decided at the upcoming April voters' meeting. Whatever is decided, it will be important for the congregation to unite around its leaders at this time and trust in God's guidance and faithfulness. Changes are inevitable, but God's steadfast love and care for his people are also certain and unchanging.

Cross of Glory's ministry and people will remain in my thoughts and prayers always.

Cross of Glory was planted by the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod (WELS) in March 1998 so that with the Gospel of Jesus she can strengthen the faith of her members and reach out into the community with the free gift of salvation. First worship services began at Easter 1999; the dedication of our Ministry Center at Easter, 2005. On Easter of 2017, we began services at our second site in the Vistancia community. Our synod's name reflects that her founders began in the state of Wisconsin. As a WELS church we still hold to the teachings of the Bible restored in the Reformation era. We

- a Christ-preaching church. We preach that Jesus is true God, the Son of God who became man, so that through his perfect life and innocent death, He is the prophesied "Lamb of God" who has taken away the sin of the world.
- a Bible-believing church. We teach that the Bible is the verbally inspired, inerrant Word of God, the only authority for Christian faith and life. We aim to teach God's Word in all its truth and simplicity.
- an evangelical church. We trust the Bible's claim that God saves people through the power of the Gospel in the Word and Sacraments. The Gospel is the Good News (the Evangel) about Jesus' saving work. The WELS has congregations throughout the USA and around the world to share the Evangel, the Bible's primary message, with all people.
- a people-caring church. That we're all sinners equally saved by Jesus' substitutionary work strips away human judgments and egos. This truth also empowers us to live Jesus' love for all people by offering friendship, support, and Biblical counseling. Our church family cares about other people-- including you.

Our Preschool & Elementary School exists to help parents in their God-given duty of teaching the Faith to their children: an important aspect of our Church's plan to grow a comprehensive womb-to tomb ministry that serves souls for eternity.
