


HE LIVES TO BE THE ONLY WAY TO HEAVEN The gospel is the most inclusive message in the world. The benefits of the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ are meant for every man, woman, and child who ever lived. The gospel is also the most exclusive message in the world, for it maintains that salvation can only be found in one place—the person of Jesus Christ. Just listen to how Jesus speaks: "I am the way and the truth and the life" (John 14:6). Jesus doesn't say, "I will show you the true way to eternal life." The prophets and apostles could say that. But Jesus says, "I am the way. I am the truth. I am the life you crave." And note that definite article: "the," not "a"! Jesus is not a way into heaven. He is the way. There is no other way than through faith in the One who died and rose again. The unbelieving world finds this claim—that Jesus Christ is the only way to heaven—to be the most offensive teaching in all of Scripture. Yet this is the very truth upon which Christ builds his Church.







The claim that Jesus is the only way to heaven is like a stone over which unbelievers stumble. But that truth is the cornerstone on which Christ builds his Church.



⁴As you come to him, the living Stone—rejected by humans but chosen by God and precious to him— ⁵you also, like living stones, are being built into a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood, offering spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. ⁶For in Scripture it says:

"See, I lay a stone in Zion, a chosen and precious cornerstone, and the one who trusts in him will never be put to shame."

⁷Now to you who believe, this stone is precious. But to those who do not believe,

"The stone the builders rejected has become the cornerstone," ⁸and,

"A stone that causes people to stumble

and a rock that makes them fall."

They stumble because they disobey the message—which is also what they were destined for.

⁹But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light. ¹⁰Once you were not a people, but now you are the people of God; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy.






A verse from the Holy Scriptures is usually spoken to capture the theme of the service. The sung response is taken from Romans 10:17

Sermon

He Lives to be the Only Way to Heaven

¹⁴Do not let your hearts be troubled. You believe in God; believe also in me. ²My Father's house has many rooms; if that were not so, would I have told you that I am going there to prepare a place for you? ³And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am. ⁴You know the way to the place where I am going." ⁵Thomas said to him, "Lord, we don't know where you are going, so how can we know the way?"

⁶Jesus answered, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. ⁷If you really know me, you will know my Father as well. From now on, you do know him and have seen him."

⁸Philip said, "Lord, show us the Father and that will be enough for us."

⁹Jesus answered: "Don't you know me, Philip, even after I have been among you such a long time? Anyone who has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, 'Show us the Father'? ¹⁰Don't you believe that I am in the Father, and that the Father is in me? The words I say to you I do not speak on my own authority. Rather, it is the Father, living in me, who is doing his work. ¹¹Believe me when I say that I am in the Father and the Father is in me; or at least believe on the evidence of the works themselves.

The Nicene Creed

After hearing the word of God, the worshiper responds with this confession of faith.

The Nicene Creed was written in 325 A.D. to address false ideas about the divinity of Jesus Christ. That explains why the second article of the Nicene Creed is longer than its counterpart in the Apostles' Creed.

- M: The world claims everything evolved by accident. But what do Christians believe?
- C: We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.
- M: The world claims Jesus was only a noble and novel man. But what do Christians believe?
- C: We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation, he came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the virgin Mary, and became truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate. He suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.
- M: The world claims all people have an inborn, godly spirit. What do Christians believe?
- C: We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who in unity with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy Christian and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.


The pastor and people get ready to celebrate the Holy Meal by greeting each other and with an exhortation as how to celebrate the meal.



Sanctus is a Latin word meaning "Holy". The Sanctus contains words from Isaiah's vision of God (Isaiah 6:3) and the crowd's response on Palm Sunday when Jesus entered the city of Jerusalem (Matthew 21:9). We join them in spirit by singing their words as we anticipate Christ's coming in the sacrament.







Highlights of the Open Forum on April 27

The meeting was led by District President Jon Buchholz. About 50 members attended. A Bible study of Acts 1:15-26 showed how the apostles and early church chose a man to complete a vacancy among them. The procedure included the following:

- It was required that the candidates be eyewitnesses of Jesus' entire ministry. (Today, that means a ministry candidate should be thoroughly trained.)
- Two candidates were identified. (Today, four or five candidates will be listed.)
- The apostles prayed for guidance by the Holy Spirit. (Today, the members pray for guidance by the Holy Spirit.)
- Lots were cast, and the man was chosen. (Today, a vote is taken for the final candidate.)

The biblical qualifications for a pastor were listed. They include the following: able to teach, possessing a knowledge of Scripture, humble, above accusations of past indiscretion. More qualification may be found in 1 Timothy 3.

Pastor Buchholz reviewed the results of the online questionnaire that was sent to every Cross of Glory member. Thirty-eight questionnaires were completed. The five areas of ministry where members felt Cross of Glory congregation "does especially well" are listed in order of perceived strength:

- Elementary school and preschool
- Worship experience
- Preaching
- Bible study
- Social and fellowship events

The five areas of ministry where members felt Cross of Glory congregation "struggles or has room for significant improvement" are listed in order of perceived weakness:

- Ministry to teens
- Administration
- Reclaiming delinquent members
- Ministry to college age
- Ministry to re-singles

Highlights of the Voters' Meeting on April 30

* The meeting was well attended, and our new schedule (including a potluck meal prior to the meeting) seemed to work well.

* Motions were passed detailing the duties and compensations of interim vacancy Pastor Piepenbrink and assisting Pastors Kugler and Freeman. A motion was also passed to call a more permanent vacancy pastor, Rev. Paul Mueller, who is retiring from Cross of Christ, Kingman, Arizona. He will serve Cross of Glory from July 1 to December 31, 2023.

* Mrs. Lianne Coates' hours as finance manager were increased to 35 hours per week to handle all the work that it takes to keep things running in a church and school of our size.

* Three one-year calls were extended to keep our staff intact for the coming 2023/2024 school year.

* The 2023/2024 budget was presented. After some discussion concerning a couple topics related to the budget, it passed as presented without any changes.

* The voters approved a motion to improve our campus' appearance. Our two older buildings will receive new exterior doors and fresh paint. We also will be purchasing new chairs for our church sanctuary. A subcommittee is being formed to make some decorating decisions related to this motion. The voters also agreed with the council's decision to save about \$35,000 per year over the next two to three years to replace our aging HVAC system.

* A motion to allow Billy M. to remove our pump house for a "generous donation" passed. Some concerns about liability were raised, and the president is planning on asking him to sign a contract that clearly out-lines liability issues for both parties.

* The voters approved the following council actions made on their behalf over the last three months: hiring Novak Financial Services to keep our finances on track, switching to One Church (a church management software), making a decision to continue to maintain our own landscaping, allowing the Woodworth food truck to be stored on campus and to be used for special events, and forming a new building committee.

Cross of Glory was planted by the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod (WELS) in March

1998 so that with the Gospel of Jesus she can strengthen the faith of her members and reach out into the community with the free gift of salvation. First worship services began at Easter 1999; the dedication of our Ministry Center at Easter, 2005. Our synod's name reflects that her founders began in the state of Wisconsin. As a WELS church we still hold to the teachings of the Bible restored in the Reformation era. We are...

- a Christ-preaching church. We preach that Jesus is true God, the Son of God who became man, so that through his perfect life and innocent death, He is the prophesied "Lamb of God" who has taken away the sin of the world.
- a Bible-believing church. We teach that the Bible is the verbally inspired, inerrant Word of God, the only authority for Christian faith and life. We aim to teach God's Word in all its truth and simplicity.
