Welcome to VBS Sunday! Last week we traveled on a **Great Jungle Journey: An Epic Cruise from Genesis to Revelation.** We cruised through jungle rivers, making stops along the way—each starting with a C. These represent seven key biblical events of history.

Day 1: Creation—Our first C takes us back to the beginning of time and the creation of the universe when it was all good.

Day 2: Corruption and Catastrophe—Next, Adam sinned, and God formed a plan to save Adam and all his descendants. Everything God did from that point forward was to save us including sending a global flood.

Day 3: Confusion—The fourth C checks out the events that began at the tower of Babel.

Day 4: Christ and the Cross—At these stops, we realized once again that man is sinful and needs a Savior. Because of his great love, God provided one in his Son!

Day 5: Consummation—The last C shows the thrilling conclusion to history when all goes back to very good again, and God wins against sin and Satan.

In our service today, we will review the Bible readings and the important truths we learned this week. In addition, we will view videos of the VBS participants singing some of the songs they learned. May God bless the children who learned God's truths this week and we who worship this morning as we praise our God for his perfect plan to save mankind.

M: God gave his Word so "that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, that by believing you may have life in his name". The Scriptures testify about Jesus, who lived a perfect life for you, died on the cross to pay for all your sins, and rose again to assure you of your salvation. Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Catechism Review: 1st & 2nd Commandment

(Spoken Responsively)

- M: You shall have no other gods. What does this mean?
- C: We should fear, love, and trust in God above all things.
- M: You shall not misuse the name of the Lord your God. *What does this mean?*
- C: We should fear and love God that we do not use his name to curse, swear, lie, or deceive, or use witchcraft, but call upon God's name in every trouble, pray, praise, and give thanks.



For five centuries, Martin Luther's Small Catechism has served as the basic instruction book for the church. It directs us to God's Word and points to the only source for spiritual life, the Means of Grace: the Word and Sacraments. As lifelong students of the Catechism, we review these important truths from God's Word as we continue to grow in a deep appreciation for all that Jesus has done as our Savior.



The main thoughts of the day are collected or summarized in this short prayer.



Our journey begins at the first week of history, when God created everything in heaven and the earth as well as the crown of his creation, humankind. The triune God declared his complete and perfect creation good.

M: Gracious God, you nourish my faith with the good news that you have forgiven my sins in Christ. 

(Spoken by Minister)

- M: Eternal Father, your Word is a lamp for our feet and a light to our path. You inspired the Scriptures for teaching, rebuking, correcting, and training in right-eousness, so that your servants might be thoroughly equipped for every good work.
- C: Lead us to love your Word more and more and to receive your message with great eagerness.
- M: You have given us your Word that we may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing we may have life in his name. Enable us to see the wonders of your love in Christ from the beginning to the end of your holy book.
- C: Help us to see Jesus, the pioneer and perfector of our faith.
- M: Work in all your people, especially in parents, the resolve and patience to teach little children the simple truths about the Savior who loves them. Walk with us as we take our children to the manger, the cross, and the empty tomb. Let them find Jesus in stories, songs, and prayers.
- C: Move us to bring up our children in the training and instruction of the Lord.
- M: Provide wisdom and commitment to teachers who train our young people in Sunday Schools and youth Bible classes. Deepen their knowledge of your Word as they prepare and share the lessons they teach. Move them to model a sincere devotion to the Scriptures.
- C: Lead us to plan for and support the Christian training of children.
- M: We thank you for enabling our congregation to provide elementary education for our children. We know our schools are your special blessing, and we pray for the resolve to establish and maintain standards of excellence in all aspects of education. Move us to be generous in our offerings so that teachers may teach and students may learn in fitting surroundings.
- C: Lead us to provide Christian schools that reflect the immensity of your love.
- M: Work in us that we may find the lasting value of growing in the grace and knowledge of Christ. Lead us to be faithful in our personal study of the Scriptures and in participating in regular Bible classes. Rid us of all thoughts that

Christian education ends in our youth. Make us life-long students of your precious Word.

- C: Lead us to believe that at every age your Word remains a lamp for our feet and a light to our path.
- M: How can a young person stay on the path of purity? By living according to your Word. Even when we are old and gray, lead us to meditate on your decrees that we may delight in your wonderful deeds.
- C: Do good to your servants, Lord, according to your Word. Amen.

Cross of Glory was planted by the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod (WELS) in March 1998 so that with the Gospel of Jesus she can strengthen the faith of her members and reach out into the community with the free gift of salvation. First worship services began at Easter 1999; the dedication of our Ministry Center at Easter, 2005. Our synod's name reflects that her founders began in the state of Wisconsin. As a WELS church we still hold to the teachings of the Bible restored in the Reformation era. We are...

- a Christ-preaching church. We preach that Jesus is true God, the Son of God who became man, so that through his perfect life and innocent death, He is the prophesied "Lamb of God" who has taken away the sin of the world.
- a Bible-believing church. We teach that the Bible is the verbally inspired, inerrant Word of God, the only authority for Christian faith and life. We aim to teach God's Word in all its truth and simplicity.
- an evangelical church. We trust the Bible's claim that God saves people through the power of the Gospel in the Word and Sacraments. The Gospel is the Good News (the Evangel) about Jesus' saving work. The WELS has congregations throughout the USA and around the world to share the Evangel, the Bible's primary message, with all people.
- a people-caring church. That we're all sinners equally saved by Jesus' substitutionary work strips away human judgments and egos. This truth also empowers us to live Jesus' love for all people by offering friendship, support, and Biblical counseling. Our church family cares about other people-- including you.
