REFLECTION ON REPENTANCE "The Lord is not slow to do what he promised. . . . Instead, he is patient for your sakes, not wanting anyone to perish, but all to come to repentance" (2 Peter 3:9). Martin Luther began his famous debate theses noting that Scripture's call to repentance is intended as a way of life. Using David's great penitential Psalm 51, penned following his affair with Bathsheba and the murder of Uriah, this series of Lenten reflections explores the depths of our sinful depravity, the brokenness of our relationship with God, our dire need for rescue, and the good news of forgiveness, cleansing, and rejoicing in our restored relationship with God and the promise of eternal life through Jesus our Savior.

Our journey through Lent takes the following path:






FAMILIES WITH CHILDREN

Confession of Sins

(Spoken Responsively)

- M: Our help is in the name of the Lord,
- C: the maker of heaven and earth.
- M: Let us confess our sins in the presence of God and of one another.

Almighty God, our heavenly Father,

- C: we have sinned against you in our thoughts, in our words, in our deeds, and in all that we have not done. Forgive us in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. Deliver and restore us, that we may rest in peace.
- M: By the mercy of God we are redeemed by Jesus Christ, and in him we are forgiven. Let us rest in his peace until the rising of the sun, when we shall serve him in newness of life.
- C: Amen.

We begin with the words of Luther's Evening Prayer set to music. This prayer is found in the Daily Prayer section of Luther's Small Catechism.



"If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness. " (I John 1:9)

Christ said to his disciples, "If you forgive anyone his sins, they are forgiven". The pastor speaks for God and announces God's forgiveness to those who made confession.





The main thoughts of the psalm are collected or summarized in this short prayer.



Each week during the midweek Lent services, the minister reads from the Bible a portion of Jesus' Passion history. The readings take us through the events of Holy Week—from Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem to his crucifixion on the cross.

Psalm

- M: Do good to your servant
- C: according to your word, LORD.
- M: Teach me knowledge and good judgment,
- C: for I trust your commands.
- M: Before I was afflicted I went astray,
- C: but now I obey your word.
- M: You are good, and what you do is good;
- C: teach me your decrees.
- M: It was good for me to be afflicted
- C: so that I might learn your decrees.
- M: The law from your mouth is more precious to me
- C: than thousands of pieces of silver and gold.

Psalm Prayer

M: Lord, your Word is my delight. When I was lost in the darkness of sin, you penetrated my heart with the light of your Word. Let it enlighten my path each day that I may serve you in holiness. Let your Word shine through all I say and do that others may see you and praise your saving name. In Jesus' name I pray. Amen.

(Romans 8)


The Lord's Prayer
